  - a. Most PACs have an executive:
    - i. chair or co-chairs set the agenda for meetings and run the meetings
    - ii. treasurer reports each month on the bank statements
    - iii. secretary takes minutes and distributes them
  - b. PACs work with the school administration to help support the school
  - c. Many PACs have a website and/or Facebook site
  - d. PACs receive money from the provincial government through a Gaming Grant \$20 per student. This money is kept in a separate account and can only be spent on certain things
  - e. PACs are also welcome to fundraise additional money if they want to but there's no requirement for PACs to do fundraising

  - a. The breakfast program is going great
  - b. The school will continue to develop ways to help remove barriers to learning for our kids get to the learning for our kids
  - c. On September 18<sup>th</sup>, school staff will spend their Professional Development day at th Songhees Wellness Centre learning about how to support student mental health
